

Nahanni River Expedition – NWT Canada

24th July to 7th August 2017

Spend two weeks journeying by canoe down the mighty South Nahanni River, in Canada's North West Territories.

Full of myth and legend, the Nahanni is one of the greatest canoe rivers in the world and over the years it has been the backdrop for many adventures.

We will meet at Fort Simpson on the side of the Mackenzie River and enjoy a night in a small local guest house. Next day we will travel by float plane into the Nahanni National Park and will be dropped off at Rabbitkettle Lake. From there we will start our 380km journey down the river until we finish at Lindberg Landings 14 days later.

Camp next to Virginia Falls, twice the height of Niagara (a UNESCO World Heritage Site) and climb to the summit of Sunblood Mountain. Paddle through famous sections like The Gate, Figure 8 Rapids and Cashie Rapids and down Canada's deepest river canyon at 3300'. Enjoy a relaxing soak at Kraus Hot Springs and visit the First Nation village of Nahanni Butte.



You will be guided down the river by British Canoeing coaches Martin McCarthy and Steve Banks.

The cost will be £3500 and will include –

- Accommodation in Fort Simpson the evening before starting the trip.
- The float plane flight to Rabbitkettle Lake.
- All canoes and canoeing equipment.
- Provision of all food while on the river.
- Overnight accommodation in rustic cabins at Lindberg Landings, includes evening meal.
- Road shuttle back to Fort Simpson.
